

CLASSIC BOOK BY ATHEIST SAM HARRIS CHALLENGES (AND HELPS?) BELIEVERS OF ALL FAITHS

One of the short books Patricia read to me following my retina procedure was <u>Sam Harris</u>' 115-page book <u>Letter to a Christian Nation</u>. Fortunately our spiritual community, <u>Companions on the Journey</u> (COJ), has been prepared for most of his arguments for 20 years by charismatic teacher/psychologist Fr, Seán Ó'Laoire. As far as I can tell, he agrees with much of what Harris says, but is more mystical in his approach. So, in our

impose their personal beliefs on others, misguided by toxic scriptures or by their misinformed leaders. As science gradually explains the world in more rational terms, many have been looking at all the damage over history that blind faith has caused. As defined by the OED, "Belief is an acceptance that something exists or is true, especially one without proof." (Is not *proof* also something verified by experience and/or common sense?) Faith and belief have become such an individualistic endeavor, but it can and should be questioned if it is not beneficial to the entire cosmos.

We both found Sam Harris' *Letter to a Christian Nation* refreshing in the sense that he takes on many of the beliefs still held by even moderate and liberal Christians who really haven't examined them against the ever-changing backdrop of history and science.
