Using "Agnostic" and "Ignoramus" to accurately describe the scientific method

The dictionary defines an ignoramus as "a person who does not know much: an ignorant or stupid person." In contemporary language to be called an ignoramus is an obvious insult. (1) However, originally it meant this: "The word comes right from the Latin ignoramus, literally 'we do not know,' which was a legal term in the 16th century that could be used during a trial when the prosecution presented insufficient evidence." (2)

word agnostic is defined mainly in religious is known or can be known of the existence or nature of God or of anything beyond material phenomena; a person who claims neither faith nor disbelief in God." largely with matters of faith or belief. (3)
